


Easter hunt



Thank you for downloading the Therapics Easter hunt!

This is fun for children of any age, however those who are less verbal and or unable to read will really appreciate the wordless clues! This is also a fun way to teach prepositions - the orange ball and box show the preposition and the picture icon shows the place. You may want to use this for your official Easter egg hunt, or simply a bit of fun in the easter holiday - no doubt you can find some fun easter/spring toys as an alternative to chocolate eggs if you wish. Feel free to choose whether to save your treasure for the end or to hide an egg with each clue - it's up to you.

Instructions:

Print both these pages. Cut out the clue cards and 2 cards on this page.

Decide on a small treasure which you can hide - perhaps easter eggs or a suitable easter toy.

Select from the clue cards those that are relevant to your own home.

Starting with the introduction card and first clue - hide each clue in a successive place, making the hunt as long or as short as you think will best suit the child.

End with your treasure and the final card.

Now think of a fun way to present the initial cards to your child - perhaps surprise them with it in their cereal bowl in the morning, or put it on their bedside table. Wherever you think they will find it at the time you'd like to do the hunt.

Depending on the ability of the child, you may want to stay with them and gently guide them to the correct room and or point out to them the preposition icons and how they work. This is a brilliant excuse to verbalise all those prepositions and items if your child is still learning to speak.

Above all, enjoy the fun!
